YLLABUS

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will follow a communicative approach. To develop students' knowledge of key components of the English grammar, to develop their vocabulary and to help improve pronunciation, the following will be focused on throughout the course:

I - English Language

- Speaking, Listening, and Writing
- Punctuation
- Capitalization
- Spelling
- Possessive's

II - Vocabulary and Reading

Expansion of vocabulary through reading and analyzing language in context as well as listening, speaking and writing, drawing on a selection of written texts from the adopted Course Book, *Total English—Elementary*.

- Unit 1. Your Life: talk about where you're from, Subject Pronouns + Positive Forms of *to be.*, a/an, Negative Forms of *to be.*
- Unit 2. Activities: talk about your daily routine and everyday objects, Present Simple: I, He/She, You, We, It, this/that/these/those, noun plurals.
- Unit 3. Free Time: talk about what you can/can't do and talk about your free time, Present Simple: negative, can/can't.
- Unit 4. Food: talk about quantities and numbers as well as shopping in a market, Nouns: countable and uncountable, Determiners: a/an, some, any.





- Unit 5. Home: talk about your home, important possessions, furniture, houses, Have Got, There Is/Are, Modifiers: very, quite, really.
- Unit 6. City Life: talk about the past, understand and give simple directions, Past Simple: *to be*, question forms and short answers, negative.
- Unit 8. Day to Day: describe what you are doing right now, take part in a factual conversation, Present Continuous: adverbs of manner.

III - Grammar

The use of new grammar structures through speaking and writing:

- Verbs: To Be, To Have, Can/Can´t/Could/Couldn´t, I´d like, There Is/Are;
 Have Got
- Irregular Verbs (Basic List),
- Verb Tenses:
 - o Present Simple / Past Simple,
 - o Present Continuous,
- Comparatives and Superlatives.
- Nouns: Proper/Common; Countable/Uncountable; Plurals,
- Pronouns: Personal Pronouns; Possessive Pronouns,
- **Determiners**: The; An/A/Ø; This/That; These/Those,
- Adjectives: Possessive,
- Adverbs of frequency and manner,
- **Prepositions**: Meaning and Use: place, time, movement,
- Linking words: And, So, But, Because,
- Quantifiers: How many/much?, Some, Many,
- Modifiers: Very, Quite, Really,
- Wh-Questions,
- Time Expressions.
